### Spelling

Below are four spelling lists, the learners have been directed to the appropriate list for them and only need to practise their list. You may wish to practise using the look, say, cover, write, check method. **The learners are then asked to put their words into sentences to fully embed the spelling patterns.** The learners will be tested on their spellings every **Friday**.

The spellings for this week are high frequency words that are often spelt on correctly in daily writing so they don't have a particular spelling pattern to focus on this week.
