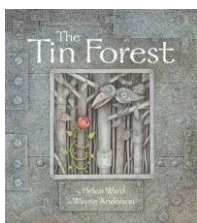

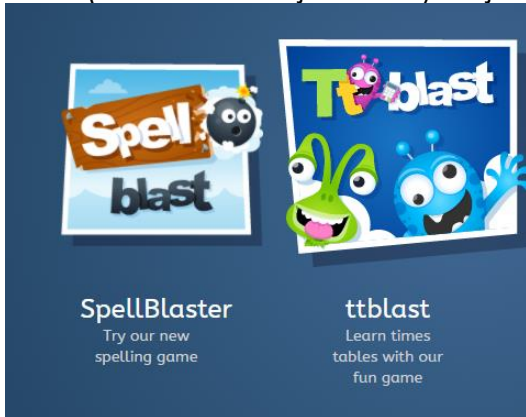
English

Hwb

In class this week we have reintroduced the children to Hwb – an online resource to support learning. We would like the children to log into Hwb using their usernames and passwords. Any device can be used to do this including desktop computers, laptops, tablets or even mobile phones. Once in Hwb we would like the children to navigate to the 'j2blast' section of Hwb (Hwb Tools -> just2easy → j2blast) and have a go at the following activities:



→ **SpellBlaster**: Allows children to practise and then test their spelling knowledge.

→ **ttblast**: Allows children to practise and then test their times tables knowledge.
