## Spelling

Because – **B**ig elephants **c**an **a**lways **u**nderstand **s**mall elephants

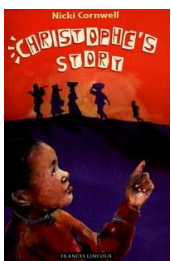

## Reading

Children should aim to read their Home Reading book 10/15 minutes every day. Many of the books have additional reading activities inside the front or back cover. Additionally, children are welcome to read: a book from home, a magazine, a newspaper or even a website such as Newsround.

## Literacy



This week in Literacy the pupils have been studying 'Christophe's Story' by Nicki Cornwell. For Home Learning we would like the pupils to carefully write a character profile about Christophe using powerful adjectives (describing words) e.g. What does he look like? What is his personality like? What experiences has he been through?

# Maths

This week in Maths the pupils have been working hard on multiplication and division. This week's Home Learning focuses on multiplying by 10 (moving all the digits one space to the left) and dividing by 10 (moving all the digits one space to the right). Children can carefully copy and complete the sums into their books:

## Multiplying by 10

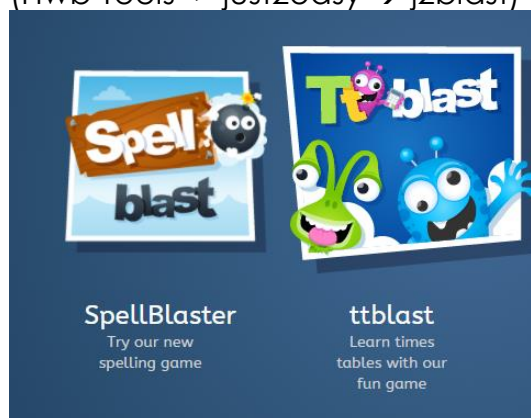
- 1)  $8 \times 10 = 80$

## Dividing by 10

- 7)  $90 \div 10 = 9$
- 8)  $150 \div 10 =$
- 9)  $190 \div 10 =$
- 10)  $270 \div 10 =$
- 11)  $380 \div 10 =$
- 12)  $5670 \div 10 =$

# Hwb

In class this week we have continued to use Hwb – an online resource to support learning. We would like the children to log into Hwb using their usernames and passwords. Any device can be used to do this including desktop computers, laptops, tablets or even mobile phones. Once in Hwb we would like the children to navigate to the 'j2blast' section of Hwb (Hwb Tools -> just2easy → j2blast) and have a go at the following activities:



→ **SpellBlaster:** Allows children to practise and then test their spelling knowledge.

→ **ttblast:** Allows children to practise and then test their times tables knowledge.
