# Geography

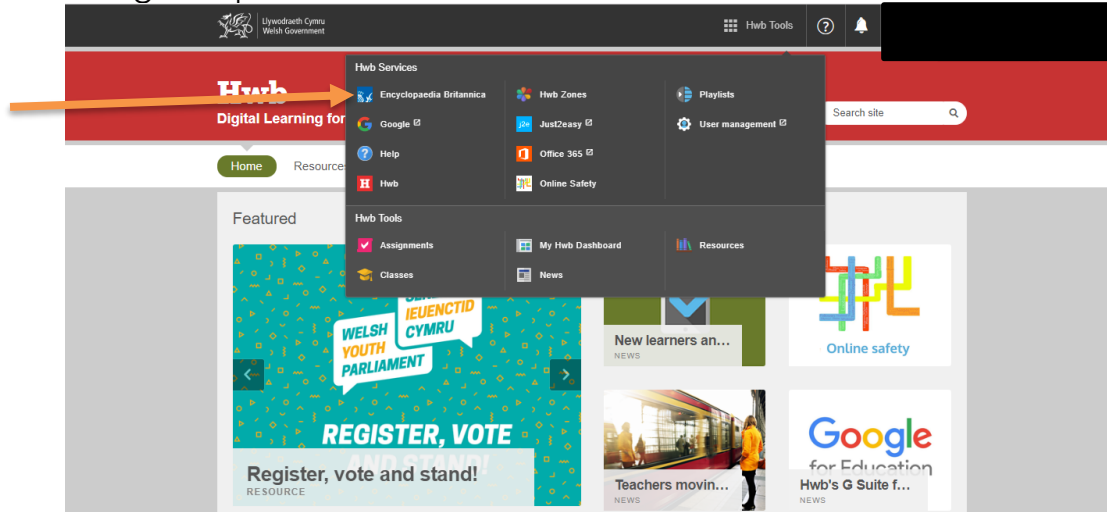

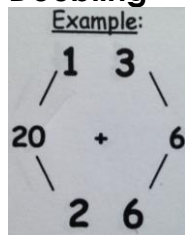
We'd also like the to encourage the children to use Encyclopaedia Britannica on Hwb to aide their learning. The picture below indicates where this useful resource is located on Hwb.



# Maths

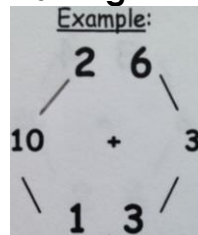
