Spelling

Please see the spelling list below. Children should know which spelling group they are in and which spellings they should be practising.

Children can practise learning the words by carefully rewriting them in their book 3 times (Look, Cover, Write, Check). The children can then use their words to create a mnemonic of their hardest spelling e.g.

Children should aim to read their Home Reading book 10/15 minutes every day. Many of the books have additional reading activities inside the front or back cover. Additionally, children are welcome to read: a book from home, a magazine, a newspaper or even a website such as Newsround.

Geography



This week Year 3 have begun their Geography learning. During 'United In Diversity' the pupils will be travelling around Europe. The children will explore the cultures, languages and landmarks of various European countries.

For Home Learning this week we would like the children to research a country from Europe. It may be a country they've visited on holiday or somewhere they are simply interested in.

Some questions they might like to consider to help them complete the activity are: **What is the main language? What is the capital city? Are there any significant events in the country's history? What typical foods are eaten? What is similar to Wales? What is different to Wales?**

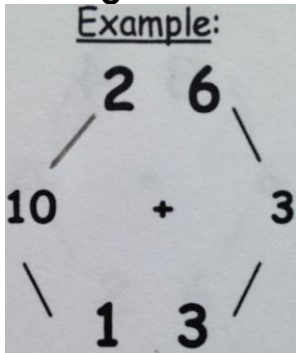
We'd also like to encourage the children to use Encyclopaedia Britannica on Hwb to aid their learning. The picture below indicates where this useful resource is located on Hwb.
